The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Minutes: Motion was made and 2nd to approve the January 2018 minutes as published. Motion carried.

<u>Treasury Report:</u> Jackie noted that the 2018 Auction made money despite the very bad weather. She also reported that the checking account name would change from Back Country Horseman Washington to the Back Country Horseman Whatcom. Gary made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report and Kathy 2nd. The motion carried.

<u>Volunteer Hours:</u> Verna reported she had received 433.4 hours for the past month Please remember to report your hours. Fran has sent a copy of the Volunteer Report for your use.

<u>DNR Volunteer Hours:</u> Though we have exceeded_our 250 hour commitment to the DNR we should continue reporting volunteer time to Gary Bellows.

<u>Director/Legislative</u>: Joe reminded everyone that March 16-18 is Rendezvous. Several folks are going if anyone is looking to ride down together.

<u>DNR Rec Plan:</u> Walden reported Motorized vehicle users had a plan presented to allocate trails for their use to the Council. It did not pass. He also pointed out the critical need for BCHW members to be a presence, be visible at the meetings and make our voices heard. Rocky had attended the DNR meeting and was impressed with the format. The meeting had four areas to attend that addressed a specific terrain. He attended the area addressing Forest Issues and came away with a new perspective on forest management that logging is not done just to generate revenue but another aspect is to open up areas for deer and elk habitat. Next meeting is April 12th in Kendall.

Work Parties/Trail Coordinator: Roger reported he will have a work party to clear for the Easter Egg Ride at Vedder Mountain on March 24th. Please show up be 9:30AM. 
