The ride was about 10 hours so everyone was glad when we made it back to the trail head.

I would like to thank Roger, Lance, Dawn, Jackie, Bret and Bruce for showing up for the work party on Saturday. What a great job everyone did. We were able to clear the trail on the upper clear cut on the south side of the creek. When we were finished working on the trail we rode up to the new trail location to bypass the bridge and flagged it. I would not recommend using the trail until we can fix some soft locations that make it unsafe. We need to have a work party soon to be able to address this issue.

Get out and ride, the weather doesn't get any better than it has been this summer.

Whatcom Chapter of Backcountry Horsemen Minutes of Monthly Meeting July 12, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u>: Motion was made by Bill McKenna and 2nd by Becky Haines to approve the June 2017 minutes as published. Motion carried.

<u>Director/Legislative</u>: Bill reported that BCHA is holding their quarterly meeting in Spokane this year. He also has some calendars, but because of a communication breakdown he only has five. He also said the State only received a partial shipment so no chapter received their full orders anyway. BCHW is celebrating 40 years this year and is getting a package of history of each chapter. On the political front, BCHA wants people to call their congressmen re: the major budget cuts to trails.

<u>Volunteer Hours</u>: Rodney read off the list of volunteers for June. 159 hours were turned in but there are probably another 50 that need to be reported.

Newsletter: Please have items to Fran by the 20th.

Work Parties/Trail Coordinator/Bosses: Blanchard: BCH didn't get the work finished but DNR hired a helicopter to finish hauling in. Andrews Creek: Jason (the Director for the independents and head of the "Hot Shot Crew") arranged the work party over the 4th of July long weekend. They cleared the log jam from trees that had blown over from the fire. The FS got a variance to use chain saws. Saturday, July 15 is the pack out from Suiattle. Rodney reported that our chapter work party is being moved to July 22 at Stewart. It will be discussed what to do once there. 8:30 a.m. start. Bring horses.

Trailheads:

- South Fork Park: This is still closed until late August.
- <u>Stewart Mt.</u>: Sharon reported the trailhead is looking ragged. The grass cap needs mowing. The chapter maintains the fence line. She also reported that if there is an emergency the fire dept. and hunters can get up on the roads, but not the Sheriff or Search and Rescue. This needs to be changed/they need a key or combination to the gate. She also reported that bears are out in force.
- <u>Vedder</u>: Roger spent 8 hours and cleared the up-hill portion, almost to the new clear cut. Walden said brushing still needs to be done. Melinda Smull mentioned it is a popular riding area and suggested posting notices on windshields about upcoming work parties to see if we could get more people to help.

<u>NW Region</u>: Rodney reported it was a great ride with 110-120 riders. Rocky said the stations had 3+ people each, which we need to keep in mind for our fund raiser.

Old Business:

- Old Settlers Parade. Rodney reminded everyone of the parade coming up. There was quite a bit of interest from the members attending. Lynn said to park at the high school at the back by the tennis courts and school buses. You need to be ready to ride at 11:00 a.m. when the parade starts. If anyone knows of some people who would like to be pooper scoopers they get paid from donations taken up at the parade.
- <u>Confidence Builder Continuance</u>. The committee is still researching ideas. Geri mentioned other ways to develop revenue. Some ideas were a rummage sale at Nancy Giordano's; relay race; cooking/food trailer at Old Settlers; having an event at Misty River; photos on ponies; beer ride.
- <u>Steward Mt. sign board</u>: Rodney wants someone to come up with the language for it and he will make the sign.




