

#### Fourth Quarter Board of Directors Meeting Highlights – Bill McKenna

Rodney Vandersypen and I attended the last BCHW meeting of the year on December 3, 2016.

**Member Retention:** In addition to our regular agenda, we heard from two presenters: Glen Glover from DNR and Craig Lewis, a consultant who has been working with the board to address our shrinking membership. After reviewing Craig's last report, we could see that there is a lot we need to do to reverse the trend, but he feels that it can be done. Some suggestions were: Calling members who have not renewed to find out why they did not rejoin; engaging with youth groups such as 4H & Job Corps; carrying club business cards with contact information to describe how they can join; inviting the media to all club functions; as well as other suggestions that would create a desire to join us. Mr. Lewis will be at our upcoming leadership conference to talk to the chapter leaders to help us increase and retain membership. I hope our chapter will send a full complement of new and old officers to the Regional Leadership meeting in North Bend, February 4, 2017. More about this later.

**DNR:** Glen Glover from DNR reported various projects going on across the state noting activity in Whatcom county trying to establish trailheads and trail systems for all user groups. He also provided us with a brief history of DNR lands in WA and the parameters they have to work within.

**Wine Ride**: From the business meeting we learned that the 2016 Wine Ride registered over 600 riders and netted more than \$18,000. With the weather as bad as it threatened to be, our ridership was down from last year but the income was good. 94 volunteers worked a total of 2300 hours. Another feature of the Wine Ride is that there is profit sharing with chapters who send volunteers. As volunteers, Michelle and I earned \$40 for our chapter. Next year's ride will be held on the last Saturday in October. More volunteers will be needed.

**State Work Party:** Jason Ridlon reported on the 2016 statewide work party at the Twisp River Horse Camp where we cleared over 52 miles of trail with 90+ volunteers and 2200 hours. The 2017 work party will take place at Gypsy Meadows north and east of Spokane on the Idaho line, August 2-5.

**2017 Rendezvous:** Plans for the 2017 Rendezvous are well underway and volunteers are needed. We also have several changes in the saw certification, and it is requested that all saw-certified members attend the certification workshop to learn of the changes. I expect to receive a detailed notice of the workshop soon, and I'll send it along as soon as I get it.

**Lobbyist Activity:** As mentioned in my last report, BCHW has terminated its relationship with our lobbyist and in his place we have named Joyce Willm of Trail Head News to be our lobbyist of record. A number of board members living in the Olympia area will make themselves available to contact legislators when needed. BCHW will expect a good showing from all chapters on our legislative and Big Tent day.

**2017 Budget:** The board adopted the 2017 budget, and a review of the treasurer's report shows that BCHW is financially sound.




# New Year's Ride, December 31, 2016 X at Heady!




