VET NOTES Sharon Hoofnagle D.V.M Generic vs Brand names

We were on a ride, about 6 miles in, with no cell phone reception. Jerry had suffered some heart issues a few years ago and was still fearful of a re-occurrence. He felt a little woozy. He asked if anyone had an aspirin. He wanted to take ¼ as a precaution. Another rider responded, handing him a tablet which Jerry gratefully took. However about half hour later Jerry quietly told me that he didn't think that it was aspirin that he had been given, probably ibuprofen or acetaminophen. He was ok, but it was a tense ride for him. There are some lessons to be learned from this case.

So what happened? The rider supplying the tablets fell into the "Kleenex" syndrome. Kleenex is a brand name for a tissue. But if we ask someone if they have a Kleenex we are actually asking for a tissue. That's ok for tissues because they are pretty much all the same, but its not ok for medications.

Medications are entirely different. All of the anti-inflammatory and analgesic drugs work differently and have different side effects. They are contraindicated in some situations. You need to know what you are taking.

Always refer to a medication by the generic name, not the brand name. For example aspirin, not Bayer, acetaminophen, not Tylenol, ibuprofen, not Advil.

If someone asks you for a medication clarify what you have and use the generic name and the strength.

If you have health issues- carry your own medications. Have them clearly labeled with the drug generic name, the strength, and the dose.

The same goes for your horses' meds. Most of us carry flunixin and phenylbutazone on long rides. They are different drugs, used in different situations. We often re-package them in smaller syringes to fit in saddlebags. Make sure they are labeled and know when and how to use them.




