VET NOTES Sharon Hoofnagle D.V.M. Fall Reminder-laminitis

The rains have started and our grasses which have been dormant for several weeks are starting to grow. That pasture that was grazed down to ½ inch may have been providing 2 lbs. of grass per day a few weeks ago. Today it may be the same height but providing 30 lbs. per day. You can't determine this because your horse is constantly mowing it. Watch your lawn, not your pasture, to determine grass growth. When you have to start mowing you know your pasture is growing also.

Cold nights-warm days concentrates sugars in grasses, making them more dangerous. Many normal horses will physiologically turn into Cushings horses during the fall months. This seems to be a normal variation in horses. Many normal horses will test positive for Cushings disease Sept thru Nov even though they do not have the disease. This normal physiological change increases the possibility of laminitis in all horses in the fall months.

What to do? Weigh your horse using a weight tape. If they start to gain, and/or if they are on rich grass, and/or they are equine metabolic condition or Cushings horses, or past history of laminitis pull them off the rich grass.

So why do we have a problem with horses? In nature animals build up a layer of fat in the summer and fall to get them through the winter when feed is scarce.

There are two major factors. We have bred equine metabolic syndrome into the modern horse. We like the appearance and the temperament. We did not realize that we were breeding for a disease. Cushings is a common condition in the old horse. Today's horses are living longer and so are more likely to develop the condition.

Just as important- modern grasses are developed to put fat on cattle. They are too rich for many horses.

Whatcom Chapter of Backcountry Horsemen Minutes of Monthly Meeting September 13, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u>: Motion was made by Bill McKenna and seconded by Susan Sebastian to approve the August 2017 minutes as published. Motion carried.

<u>Sunshine</u>: Get well cards were sent out to Julie Bartholomew. Cards will be sent to Diane Kimker and Robert Eversole.

<u>Director/Legislative</u>: Bill mentioned the quarterly Board meeting is this weekend. It is also time to get involved in the two year cycle on the grants. Mike McGlenn, Joe Remenar and Bill met with Barb Richey with the USFS and talked about the Middle Fork Bridge. The bridge is in but the grant two years ago to build it didn't cover the ramps on and off of it. They are putting together a grant to cover them. Bill would like to know of any other trails we would like work on so we can apply for a grant. He also mentioned Excelsior has a lot of bees on it.

Volunteer Hours: Rodney read off the list of volunteers. 133 hours were logged for August.

<u>DNR Volunteer Hours</u>: Reminder to turn in any time you have to Gary Bellows. The time counts from when you leave home to when you return They don't count mileage, but we can turn in our hours and travel miles for our BCH volunteer hours. Also, there have been break-ins at the upper Blanchard trailhead so keep your eyes open.

<u>Work Party/Trail Coordinator/Bosses</u>: Roger has not planned any rides in September because of the high fire danger. There is the scheduled Halloween ride in October. He packed in timbers to the bridges on Blanchard to patch holes.

<u>Trails</u>: S. Fork Park: Rodney reported that the gate is open. Right now we only have a mowed perimeter trail to ride. Rod Lamb asked Rodney if we'd be interested in putting in an ADA ramp. Susan Sebastian would like more research/information to see if we can even do it financially. <u>Stewart</u>: Sharon Hoofnagle said branches have been trimmed high enough up for horses and the trails are looking pretty good. There is still brushing that needs to be done.

<u>Fund-raising Committee</u>: Misty River is anxious to work with us to hold something there. Rodney purchased chocolate bars and had them at the meeting to resell. When sold at \$2.00 each BCH will make \$85 per 100.

<u>Stewart Mt. Trailhead Sign</u>: Rod Lamb brought our idea to Mike McFarlane. Mike wants a sign to have rules printed on it that will apply to all users. One rule is to have dogs on leash at all times. Sharon Hoofnagle was against this as the Stewart Mt. area is a great off-leash place. Plus it is difficult to ride your horse with your dog on a leash.

October Fund Raiser: There was mention of changing the October 28 Halloween ride from a donation ride to turning it into a fund raiser. It would be a dinner with salmon, rice, Caesar salad, drink and dessert. The charge would be \$15/person for the ride and dinner, children 10 and under would be \$10/plate, and \$10/plate if a person didn't want salmon. There was discussion that this might interfere with the Wine ride in Selah or the Halloween ride put on by the Cascade Chapter. Motion was made by Joe Remenar to change the date of the ride to October 14, and to do the fish, rice, salad, etc. Motion was seconded by Melinda Smull. Motion carried.






